

BABY DROP CLOTHS

These have been extremely popular on top of changing pads and as a travel changing-pad. Easy to make and prevent endless changing pad washings.

Makes (2)

__ 5/8 yard cute baby print

__ 5/8 yard flannel

__ 5/8 yd. P.U.L. fabric (a water proof polyester)(I use white 'cause it will be inside)

__ Fun thread to match

__ Chalk-o-liner

Pre-wash and dry flannel and cotton and press flat.

1. Cut the cotton & flannel 18" x width of fabric, then split on the fold or cut with rotary; approx. 21 or 22 inches wide
2. Cut the 22 1/2" piece of PLU into three 18" sections. You will have one left over. Trim the length to the size of the cottons.
3. Put the shiny side of the PLU down on a table. Place the flannel right side up on top of it. Then the cute cotton print right side down on the flannel.
4. Pin, perpendicular to the edges. Use a 3/8" seam allowance and sew around this rectangle, leaving a 4" opening in the middle of one end.
5. Clip excess seam allowance at the corners and turn right side out. Press opening edges in to line up with stitched side.
6. Change stitch length to a 3. Sew around the outside edge at 1/4", catching the opening.
7. Draw a line 4" from each long side and 6" from each short side. Top-stitch through all layers. This will help keep it looking nice through multiple washings.

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
