

MAGIC POT HOLDER

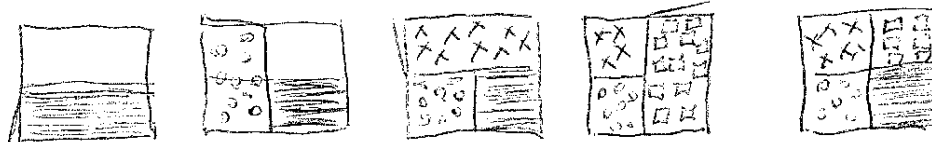
- (5) 10 inch squares (one will be the back) + 1 ½" x 5" for loop
- (1) 10 inch square ironing board cover fabric
- (1) 10 inch square 100% cotton batting

Fold four 10" squares in half, right side out and press.

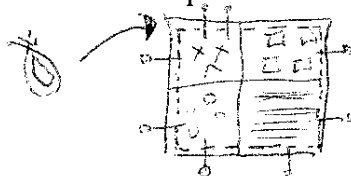
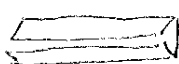


Lay out 10" squares as listed:

1. Ironing Board Silver Fabric, right side down.
2. Batting
3. Backing, right side up
4. Place a folded square with the raw edges to the bottom of the stack.
5. Place another folded piece, raw edges to the left side.



6. Lay another folded piece raw edges to the top.
7. Put the final folded piece on raw edges to the right.
8. Now, tuck the lower half of the last folded piece under the first.
9. If you want a fabric hanger cut a 1 ½" strip. Fold edges to center, lengthwise, then fold in half. Press and top stitch. Cut to 5" and create a loop. Pin at a corner, between back square and front folded pieces.



10. Pin and sew around edges using a " 3/8" seam. Use a walking foot if available. Trim corners, turn right side out from center opening.
